

During the interim, the Office of Inspector General (OIG) has continued to work on investigations and report preparation. The office has been engaged in investigations that are still ongoing at this time. Some investigations by their very nature take more time and involve detailed technical subjects. Unfortunately, we are unable to share information that relates to ongoing investigations.

Once an investigation has been completed, the final written report is provided to the Accountability in Government Oversight (AGO) Committee, which is the management committee that provides oversight to the OIG. The AGO Committee is kept up to date with what the OIG is working on throughout the investigative process. They also review and approve final investigative reports. The reports are then published on the OIG webpage and are fully accessible to the public.

In addition, the OIG assesses complaints that are submitted to the office to determine whether the matter falls within the purview of the OIG. There are also situations in which the OIG may conduct a preliminary investigation and determine that the allegations are unsubstantiated. Such situations do not always result in an investigative report.

At the current time, the OIG is an office of two. We look forward to the new leadership and will bring the new Inspector General, Mr. Kenneth Bramlett, up to speed when he officially comes on board.
